1. Purpose of report

This report is to inform the Police and Crime Commissioner for Essex of a recommendation to extend the contract under the terms of the framework for a further year to 31 December 2014.

2. Recommendations

The recommendation is for Essex Police to continue to use the legally compliant Thames Valley Collaborative Framework for Boarding Up Services. This has been in place since 1 May 2011 and is due to expire on 31 December 2013.

3. Benefits of Proposal

This Contract provides a Service Response Centre for Emergency Boarding Up. This market has traditionally had limited potential suppliers.

In 2009/10 Thames Valley lead a collaborative OJEU Procurement on behalf of thirteen forces including Essex. At the time Kent did not wish to participate.

4. Background and proposal

The Contract involves a call-handing and administration service for despatching approved sub-contractors on behalf of the general public. The Contract is used to ensure building security in the event of fire, forced entry for warrant execution or where premises are found insecure.

7. Financial Implications

Essex Police requires an average of 60 Boarding Up requests per month at an average charge of £150 per call. This generates income for the Service Provider of £108,000 per year the majority of which is charged to owner/occupiers. A £3 referral fee is payable to Essex Police for each call which will generate an income of approximately £2,160 per year.

An Experian Financial Report was run on 4 October 2013 which confirms GRG Public Resources Ltd as a below average risk.
