1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £13,000 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the New Initiatives Fund to Essex Offender Services, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex. This would secure or lead to securing a reduction in crime and disorder.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the New Initiatives Fund grant to recruit volunteers to engage with hard-to-reach individuals, in particular current and ex offenders in the Clacton and Jaywick areas. These volunteers along with existing and newly focussed community resources (detailed below) will provide comprehensive support and engagement activities at a 'one-stop' drop in centre

3. Benefits of Proposal

3.1 The one-stop shop will provide crucial support to a cohort of offenders and exoffenders in a deprived area to reduce the likelihood of them re-offending. Participants will be given direct help, as appropriate, so that services can be accessed and individuals are better integrated into the local community and supported in leading a crime free lifestyle.

4.1 The proposal is supported by a detailed application in the required format.

5. Police and Crime Plan

- 5.1. This proposal supports the PCC's vision and delivery of the following key areas of focus:
 - Reducing youth offending and youth re-offending
 - Tackling the consequences of drug and alcohol abuse and mental health issues
 - Improving crime prevention
 - Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
 - Increasing efficiency in policing through collaborative working and innovation
