1. Purpose of report

- 1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £8,897 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the New Initiatives Fund to Epping Forest District Council, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex. This would secure or lead to securing a reduction in crime and disorder.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. Approve the allocation of the New Initiatives Fund grant to deliver the Eastside Youth Training Programme (EYTP) - a sports and physical activity project aimed at enabling young people to develop healthy lifestyles, improve their fitness and acquire self-discipline

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 In addition to receiving boxing and coaching lessons, participants in this programme will be given outreach sessions as a diversionary activity. The proposal will deliver a range of benefits including; improved levels of confidence and self-esteem for young people, deterring them from taking part in Anti-Social Behaviour, allow participants to obtain qualifications and improve their behaviour and attitudes.

- 4.1 The proposal is supported by a detailed application in the required format.

- 5.1. This proposal supports the PCC's vision and delivery of the following key areas of focus:

- Reducing youth offending and youth re-offending
- Improving crime prevention
- Ensuring local solutions meet local problems

- 9.1 There are no staffing issues



10. Equality and Diversity implications
