1. Purpose of report

To seek approval for the allocation of £19,500 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Victims Capacity Building Fund to Restorative Solutions to continue their work on developing restorative justice solutions for Essex.

2. Recommendations

It is recommended that the PCC allocate £19,500 in the form of a single tender action from the Victims Capacity Building Fund to Restorative Solutions for this service.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 This exercise is a continuation of phase 1 activity undertaken by Restorative Solutions from February April 2014. Phase 2 of this work will inform the development of the PCC's commissioning work around restorative justice services, in line with the transfer of responsibilities for victims commissioning from the MoJ to the PCC from October 2014.
- 3.2 This work will build-on the scoping report produced by Restorative Solutions in phase 1 to advise the PCC on options around implementation of restorative justice services in Essex.

4. Background

- 4.1 Restorative Solutions were successful in the original competitive tender exercise to commission a specialist agency to deliver a scoping report in relation to restorative justice services in Essex. Phase 2 of this project is to take the findings from the phase 1 report and produce a further report on how to implement the proposed solution.
- 4.2 Restorative Solutions are ideally placed to undertake phase 2 as they have built-up relations with local stakeholders, having undertaken phase 1 of the work, they have a detailed understanding of the local context and existing partners and they have indicated that they can deliver this work within the budget and timescales that we require.
