1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £934,919 (£467,459.50 as an initial payment representing a core grant and the balance upon approval of submitted plans by individual organisations) in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Community Safety Fund to recipients outlined in the table below:

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the Community Safety Fund grant to those organisations identified above for their core activities in 2014-15.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. In 2014-15 the PCC moved to a new model of funding, with 50% of the allocated budget being provided on a simple grant-funding basis and the other 50% being made available for in-year CSP-commissioned activity that meets the outcomes in the Police and Crime Plan. This first payment relates to the first 50% of funding available to organisations for their core activities. A further decision sheet will be submitted for the commissioned element of this funding.
- 3.2. This approach is intended to ensure the efficacy of funding, and will assist the PCC in measuring delivery against outcomes within the Plan.

4. Background and proposal

- 4.1 CSPs, YOTs and DAATs have submitted individual proposals outlining how they intend to allocate their funding. This is a prerequisite for the release of the funds.
- 4.2 Each organisation must also have submitted monitoring information for their 2013-14 Community Safety Fund allocation.

- 5.1. This proposal supports the PCC's vision and delivery of the following key areas of focus:
 - Improving crime prevention
 - Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
