1. Purpose of report

Report by Greg Myddelton

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £10,000 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the NIF to ROC, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the NIF grant to deliver the ROC Centre in Chelmsford.

3. Benefits of Proposal

3.1 The project involves a City-centre location to be used by a number of partnership-driven initiatives to enable and encourage greater access from a wider range of community groups.

Examples of the types of projects include;

- ROC Care; helping elderly people with dementia
- ROC mentors; supporting young people in the community and work with ex-offenders providing mediation and low-level RJ
- ROC self-esteem; providing support for domestic abuse victims
- ROC drop-in; a hub around Chelmsford's night time economy, working in partnership with Police and Street Pastors
- ROC Café; aimed at young people to reduce ASB and offending / reoffending
- ROC family; supporting single parents and families, providing marriage and parenting courses

- 3.2 The aims of this project are;
 - Protect and support vulnerable residents
 - Strengthen collaborative partnerships across Chelmsford
 - Enhance community relations
 - Significantly Reduce crime, disorder and re-offending in Chelmsford
 - Increase volunteering opportunities
 - Increase Community Cohesion
 - Improve education and awareness of the key priorities within the Police & Crime Plan and Safer Chelmsford Partnership Plan
 - Provide a safe-haven for those in distress
 - Act as a sign-posting hub for relevant agencies

4. Background and proposal

4.1 This project is supported by match-funding of £13,000 from the Essex Police Proceeds of Crime Act (POCA) and partner agencies.

5. Police and Crime Plan

- 5.1 Supports priorities in the Police and Crime Plan as follows;
 - Reduce Domestic Abuse
 - Improving crime prevention
 - Tackling the consequences of drug and alcohol abuse and mental health issues
 - Supporting victims of crime
 - Reducing youth offending and re-offending
 - Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
 - Increasing efficiency in policing through collaborative working and innovation
