## 1.0 Purpose of Report

1.1 To seek approval for a carry forward in relation to the grants activity for which the OPCC has financial control.

## 2.0 Recommendations

2.1 To approve the carry forward in relation to the grants activity for which the OPCC has financial control.

#### 3.0 Benefits of Proposal

The main benefit of the proposal is that it will enable the OPCC to use the full 2013/14 grant allocation, thus furthering the delivery of the Police & Crime Plan. This is particularly the case for the Community Safety Fund in support of the work of the Community Safety Partnerships, Drug & Alcohol and the Youth Offending Teams.

#### 4.0 Background and Proposal

4.1 Grant allocations in 2013/14 were not fully utilised for various reasons (described below). However, these unutilised funds can be spent during the 2014/15 financial year by using carry forwards. These will be in addition to 2013/14 accruals.

The reasons for not utilising the full allocation in 2013/14 were:

- Some bids received were not in line with the Police & Crime plan, and could therefore not be awarded during the 2013/14 financial year but had the potential, with amendment, to support the 2014/15 programme of work.
- Other bids were received late and therefore could not be awarded within the 2013/14 deadline. However, these organisations can still be funded from the carry forward from 2013/14, whilst fully utilising 2014/15 allocation.

The New Initiative Funding (NIF) was initially oversubscribed during 2013/14. Therefore, a very stringent selection criterion was required. This was not met by all applicant, but the strength of the bids suggested that there were a sufficient volume of applicants to provide assurance that funds would be effectively deployed during 2014/15. Applicants have subsequently been found that meet the criteria.

By using the carry forwards as above, the full 2013/14 budget can be spent to fund initiatives that further the achievement of the Police & Crime plan.

## 5.0 Police and Crime Plan

The grants to which these carry forward requests relate serve to further the delivery of the Police & Crime Plan.

7.1 The carry forward across all the grants controlled and monitored by the OPCC equates to £300k. The breakdown is supplied below:

Community Safety Fund - £226k
Crime Reduction Initiatives - £49k

Contribution to Safeguarding Boards - £8k
