1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £19,000 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Victims Capacity Building Fund to Catch22, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the Victims Capacity Building Fund grant to deliver a young victims of crime research project to inform future commissioning.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 The proposal is to inform our future commissioning around young victims by undertaking a research project to;
 - Understand the needs and experiences of young people experiencing victimisation
 - Understand the extent and effectiveness of current practice with young people experiencing victimisation in Essex, including how services engage with this target group
 - Complete a gap and needs analysis to inform the development of service provision to meet the needs of the target group
 - Use this understanding to inform the way in which programmes can work with young people experiencing victimisation
