Title of report PCC Victims Capacity Building Fund – Develop the capacity of specialist sexual violence services across Essex (MoJ competed bid)

1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £276,671 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the Victims Capacity Building Fund to South Essex Rape & Incest Crisis Centre (SERICC), Victims Support, Essex Police & Centre for Action on Rape and Abuse (CARA), whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the Victims Capacity Building Fund grant to develop the capacity of specialist sexual violence services across Essex.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 This is a joint project between specialist sexual violence service providers and Essex Police. The project will:
 - Provide consistency of provision across south Essex, including boosting counselling and safeguarding services and introducing counsellors for young people and women with additional vulnerabilities
 - Support and establish the 'new and emerging' MoJ-funded centre in Southend, with a minimal helpline and 1:1 counselling
 - Expand general advocacy and practitioner support in the North East of the county, in response to known needs and waiting lists
 - Provide early support and advocacy for young people more generally across Essex, and strengthen existing Independent Sexual Violence

- Advisor (ISVA) support for those going through the CJS with an emphasis on male victims
- Introduce a single point of contact for Sexual Offence Investigation Teams for referrals to ISVA services, developing a consistent approach, clearer process, help define and redefine pathways and follow up on victims' experience

4. Background and proposal

4.1 An application was made by the PCC to the Ministry of Justice's Competed Fund to develop capacity for sexual violence services. Essex was successful in attracting this additional investment from the Ministry of Justice and will pass-port this funding to service delivery agencies specified in the table below:
