1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £20,134 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the NIF to Ministry of Parenting, whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the NIF grant to deliver the SAAIF project in Mid-Essex.

3. Benefits of Proposal

3.1 This early intervention initiative works with parents/carers and adolescents who are engaged in or affected by adolescent to parent violence (APV).

3.2 The project aims to:

- Reduce adolescent violence, aggression and all forms of abuse towards parents / carers (thus reducing the risk of adolescents becoming adult perpetrators of domestic abuse)
- Supports the victims of abuse as they regain their confidence to parent with greater control
- Reduce harmful attitudes and behaviours in interpersonal relationships now and in the future
- Keep young people out of the criminal justice system, enabling them to make appropriate decisions and to accept that there are consequences to their actions

- Support positive emotional and mental resilience of young people thus improving their ability to succeed and achieve in school and their communities
- Reduce the high cost services required as a consequence of social exclusion and criminal behaviour
- Involve local youth police officers in the programme to ensure increased efficiency in policing through collaborative working and innovation.

4.1 This application is supported by a proposal in the standard form. The project benefits from match-funding of £16,247.64.
