1. Purpose of report

- 1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £12.200 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the NIF to Achievement Through Football (ATF), whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1. Approve the allocation of the NIF grant to deliver 2 x 2 hour football sessions to provide for referrals from Southend probation PPO team, CRI and IYSS.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 The main focus of the sessions are to challenge negative behaviour in young people and provide meaningful occupation, volunteering opportunities and engagement.

3.2 The project aims to;



- Reduce offending
- To contribute towards reducing ASB in 'hot spot' areas
- Remove the financial barrier of participating in structured football
- Provide a supportive framework to encourage young people to get involved regardless of their skill level
- Provide accredited education to challenge negative behaviour patterns
- Provide scholarship opportunities to an affiliated league club.
