1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £3,500 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the NIF to Albert Edward Hall Community Centre.

2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the NIF grant to allocate £3,500 for the development of a purpose built local community centre.

3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 The community centre will house a number of local organisations including The Bocking's Elm Youth Club, Bocking Elm Speedwatch, Neighbourhood Watch, and G.E.B.E.R.A Bocking Elm Residents Association. It will act as a community hub, helping to build community spirit within the local area, it will reduce anti-social behaviour, social isolation and will build resilience within communities.
- 3.2 The Community Centre intends to work closely with local PCSOs,
 Neighbourhood and Crime watch and hold equipment marking, workshops,
 drop in centre's at the centre we would hope to set up a speed watch
 headquarters where individual groups in Clacton/Tendring can share
 equipment allowing a larger amount of patrols within Clacton, Jaywick and St
 Osyth.

4. Background and proposal

4.1 This bid is supported by match-funding of £240,000 over 3 years.
