## 1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for an allocation of £250 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the CSDF to Essex Police whose activities will contribute to the priorities set out in the Police and Crime Plan for Essex.

#### 2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve the allocation of the CSDF grant to Essex police to support the Road Safety campaign in Basildon.

#### 3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1 The project's main aims are;
  - To engage with the local community and children to raise the awareness of the dangers of the A127
  - to show the local community that relevant authorities/partners are responding to the situation and local concerns
  - to hold a competition to design road safety signs

#### 4. Background and proposal

4.1 Following the death of a teenager on the A127 in February 2016, Essex Police will be holding a competition with Crayshill school to design a road sign to raise the awareness of the dangers of crossing the road.

4.2 The road sign will also aid the local travelling community who, for a large number, are unable to read.

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- 4.3 The campaign and competition will also assist in raising awareness of the importance of road safety for students at Crayshill school.
- 4.4 The funding will be used to purchase vouchers or equipment as prizes for the top 3 entries in the competition.

#### 5. Police and Crime Plan

Supports priorities in the Police and Crime Plan as follows;

- □ Ensuring local solutions meet local problems
- supporting victims of crime
- reducing youth offending and all types of re-offending
- Improving road safety
