## 1. Purpose of report

1.1. To seek approval for the allocation of £2,500 in the form of a crime and disorder reduction grant from the 2016-17 Community Safety Fund to Brake.

### 2. Recommendations

2.1. Approve payment to the road safety charity Brake as a contribution to their national helpline and victim support packs.

### 3. Benefits of Proposal

- 3.1. Brake is a national charity that provides specialist support for bereaved and seriously injured road crime victims in partnership with police. Victim support packs are given to bereaved families by police promptly following every road death, in line with police protocols. They provide advice on CJS procedures, practical matters, and emotional comfort.
- 3.2. The national helpline uses trained professionals to provide needs-orientated support, signposting, information and advocacy on emotional, practical, domestic and procedural matters, often supporting victims through CJS procedures and liaising with police and other officials on families' behalf.

4.1. Brake's support packs and helpline are part-funded by the Ministry of Justice and other PCC offices.
